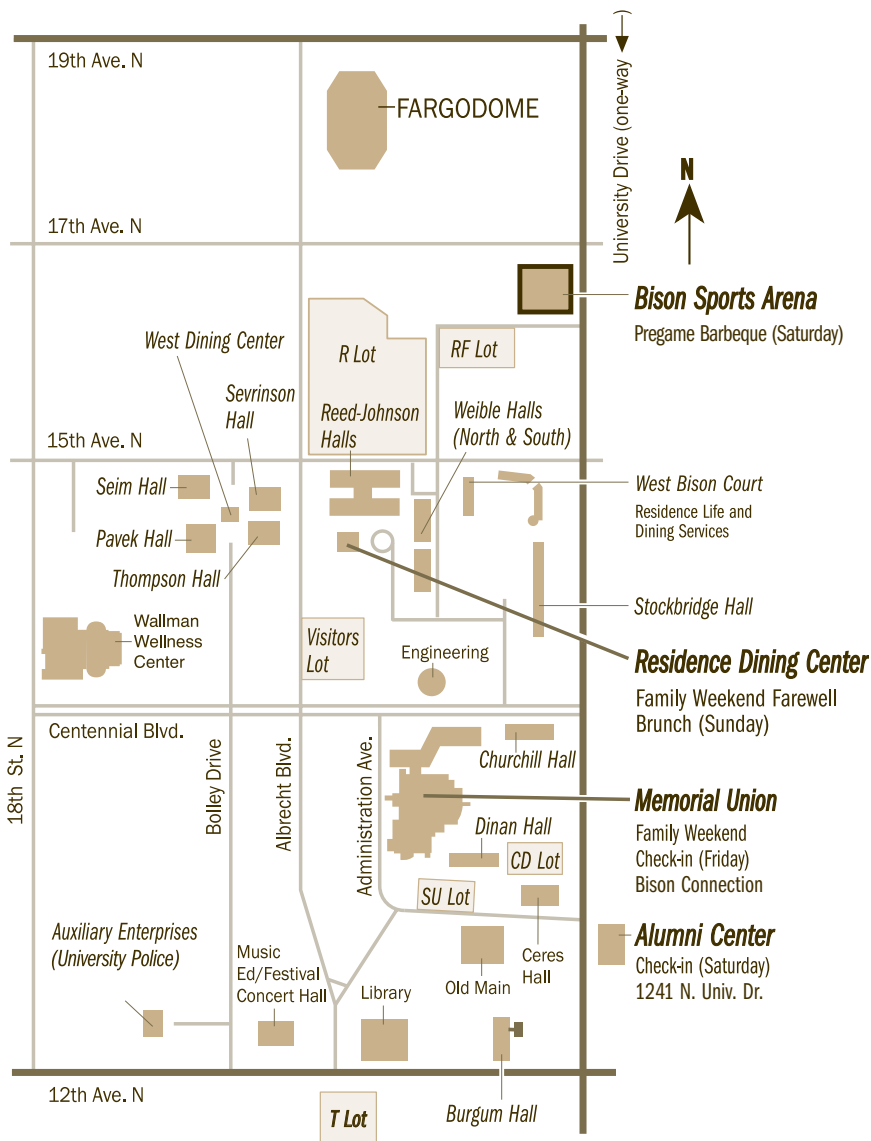
The great part about Family Weekend is we want you to go at your own pace. If you would prefer to only attend one or two events, feel free to do so. We like to provide a variety of events for your choice.
